Ranch starts new chapter with new programs

The Lakota Ranch is starting a new chapter, by offering therapeutic riding lessons and wagon ride tours of the facility, starting this weekend.

The ranch, which had been the home of the famed white buffalo calf Lightning Medicine Cloud, also welcomed the Wounded Warrior Project Saturday at the

facility, 2888 U.S. Highway 380, just west of the Greenville city limits.

Owners Arby and Pat Little Soldier said the wagon rides through the ranch will continue each weekend through New Year's, at \$8 per person.

The therapeutic riding lessons are being conducted through Greenville Speech & Language Therapy PLLC, which offers corrective treatment for most individuals with speech and/or lan-

guage disorders.

A speech disorder refers to a problem with the actual production of sounds, whereas a language disorder refers to a difficulty understanding or putting words together to communicate ideas.
